1. DEFINITIONS AND RULES OF CONSTRUCTION**1.1 Definitions**

“**Distribution**” is defined as a publication being:

- sent by mail, or
- sent by fax, or
- notice sent by e-mail and publication placed on the FITA website, as requested by the Member Association.

“**Publication**” is defined as printed matter or documents in electronic format to be able to be read through commonly available computer systems.

1.2 Rules of Construction

In the FITA Rules & Constitution the following rules of construction apply:

- The masculine or feminine gender used in relation to any physical person shall, unless there is a specific provision to the contrary, be understood as including the other gender;
- As used herein, the words “may not”, “shall” and “will” are to be interpreted as a mandatory provision.
- In determining majorities, there will be always a rounding up to the nearest integer, eg the simple majority of 67 is 34, the two-third majority of 67 is 45 ($67/3 \times 2 = 44.66$, rounded up to 45).

2. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

Following the decisions of Congress in Madrid the C&R Book has been updated. We have tried to improve the wording of many articles. Rule changes are highlighted by underlining the relevant passages. When articles have been deleted the old article is referred to.

1. For practical reasons the C&R Book has been divided into 5 Books.
Some appendixes have been deleted, they will become part of the Organizer's Manuals
Book 1 - Constitution - Administration (Chapters 1-6) (new appendix 13 and 14)
Book 2 - Outdoor Target Archery (Chapter 7)
Book 3 - Indoor Target Archery (Chapter 8)

The bylaws approved by Council will be listed in this Addendum until approved by Congress in 2007.

The bylaw texts as printed represent the complete new valid rule texts. Following the procedure of changes in the C&R Book the deleted parts have been left out and the new passages (added or changed) are underlined.

These bylaws will be published in the FITA Info and on the FITA website.

The format of both publications will allow you to add the new bylaws to your printed loose-leaf edition of the 2006 C&R rule book

BYLAWS**Approved by FITA Council on 8 October 2005****Effective as of 1 April 2006****Book 1, Appendix 5, Article 7.3****7.3 Results Management for Tests initiated by Member Associations**

Results management conducted by Member Associations shall be consistent with the general principles for effective and fair results management which underlie the detailed provisions set forth in Article 7.1. Results of all Adverse Analytical Findings including information on the athlete concerned as per Art. 14.3 of these rules shall be reported to FITA within 14 days of the reception of the laboratory report by the Member Association. Member Associations shall keep FITA fully apprised as to the status of the results management process and its conclusions (including a planned date of the hearing) in all pending cases. Any apparent anti-doping rule violation by an Athlete who is a member of that Member Association shall be promptly referred to an appropriate hearing panel established pursuant to the rules of the Member Association or national law. Apparent anti-doping rule violations by Athletes who are members of another Member Association shall be referred to the Athlete's Member Association for hearing.

BYLAWS**Approved by FITA Council on 8 October 2005****Effective as of 1 April 2006****Book 1, Appendix 5, Article 14.3:****14.3 Doping Control Information Clearing House**

When a Member Association has received an Adverse Analytical Finding on one of its Athletes it shall report the following information to FITA and WADA within fourteen (14) days of the reception of the related laboratory report: the Athlete's name, gender, date of birth, country, sport and discipline within the sport, whether the test was In-Competition or Out-of-Competition, the date of Sample collection and the analytical result reported by the laboratory. The Member Association shall also regularly update FITA and WADA on the status and findings of any review or proceedings conducted pursuant to Article 7 (Results Management), Article 8 (Right to a Fair Hearing) or Article 13 (Appeals), and comparable information shall be provided to FITA and WADA within 14 days of the notification described in Article 7.1.9, with respect to other violations of these Anti-Doping Rules. In any case in which the period of Ineligibility is eliminated under Article 10.5.1 (No Fault or Negligence) or reduced under Article 10.5.2 (No Significant Fault or Negligence), FITA and WADA shall be provided with a written reasoned decision explaining the basis for the elimination or reduction. Neither FITA nor WADA shall disclose this information beyond those persons within their organisations with a need to know until the Member Association has made public disclosure or has failed to make public disclosure as required in Article 14.4 below.

I, as a member of a Member Association of FITA or participating in a FITA authorized or recognized event, hereby acknowledge and agree as follows:

1. I have received information on the FITA Anti-Doping Rules and had an opportunity to review them.
2. I consent and agree to comply with and be bound by all of the provisions of the FITA Anti-Doping Rules, including but not limited to, all amendments to the Anti-Doping Rules* and all International Standards* incorporated in the Anti-Doping Rules.
3. I consent and agree to the creation of my profile in WADA Doping Control Clearing House (ADAMS) and/or any other authorized National Anti-Doping Organisations (NADOs) similar system under FITA's agreement for the sharing of information, and to the entry on my doping control and Therapeutic Use Exemptions related data in such systems.
4. I acknowledge and agree that FITA and its Member Associations have jurisdiction to impose sanctions as provided in the FITA Anti-Doping Rules.
5. I also acknowledge and agree that any dispute arising out of a decision made pursuant to the FITA Anti-Doping Rules, after exhaustion of the process expressly provided for in the FITA Anti-Doping Rules, may be appealed exclusively as provided in Article 13 of the FITA Anti-Doping Rules to an appellate body for final and binding arbitration, which in the case of International-Level Athletes is the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
6. I acknowledge and agree that the decisions of the arbitral appellate body referenced above shall be final and enforceable, and that I will not bring any claim, arbitration, lawsuit or litigation in any other court or tribunal.
7. I have read and understood this Acknowledgement and Agreement.

Book 1, Appendix 14**3. SCORING PROCEDURE**

see Book 2; Chapter 7; the following text replaces articles 7.6.1.5-7

In the Elimination and Finals of the Olympic Round, Elimination and Finals Rounds, the value of the arrows will be determined and recorded by the Spotter and the Scorer in the order they are shot. These unofficial recorded values will be checked by the Target Judge if required when the official scoring takes place at the target. The agent of the opposing athlete/team will check the value of close arrows on the opponents targets. In case of disagreement between the two archers agents the assigned Target Judge makes the final decision. To verify the score the Target Judge calls the arrow scores in descending order. The Scorer and the athlete's agent check the correctness of the arrow scores in the target on the scorecards. The Target Judge must sign any changed score.
