Little did I realize then the beginning of a fiercely competitive but lasting friendship. Arlyne is a dedicated archer who has spent many hours not only practicing, but also experimenting and learning the little intangibles about equipment. This ranks her high among the women archers who have a very thorough knowledge of the mechanics of their equipment. Arlyne has consistently shot well since she began in 1959, and always finished high in the National Field Archery Association Championships. She placed second in 1966 at Point Pleasant, West Virginia. More time to devote to shooting, plus fierce competitiveness coupled with her extensive knowledge and self-sufficiency, make her future in archery very promising.

In the following pages you will find a unique combination of the mathematical preciseness of Bob Rhode blended with the warm and human touch of lovely Arlyne Ruhl, as they have sought to portray the archers of our time.

#### INTRODUCTION

It seems as if it were only yesterday that I wrote the introduction to the first edition of Archery Champions. However it was over a dozen years ago. When I think back on my twenty years of competitive shooting and the hundreds of friends I have made in archery, the oldest and finest of all sports, I wonder if the young shooters will find the enjoyment and satisfaction I have.

Many changes have taken place in competitive archery in the last twenty year. In the early 1950's target archery was the most popular phase of competitive archery. Field archery was just getting a good start. It was also about this time the United States started having representation at the World Target Championships. Not until 1957 did the United States send its first full team to the world's championships in Prague, Czechoslovakia. That year the U.S. team swept the first three places in both the men's and women's divisions. This had never been done before nor has it been done since. While there is little doubt in my mind that it was the finest team we have ever sent, some credit must be given to the Americans superior equipment. A gap which has since been closed.

By 1958 field archery had surpassed target archery in popularity. The 1958 National Field Archery Championships at Grayling, Michigan drew over 1400 shooters, to this day that is the largest outdoor tournament ever held. The next year commenced the first major indoor archery championship. This phase of archery has proven most popular of all competitive archery. The 1968 International Indoor Championship drew over 1500 shooters.

I still feel target archery is the main stay of competitive archery the world over even though field and indoor archery have been able to draw larger attendance at major archery championships. Without question the 1969 World Target Championships at Valley Forge, Pa. was the most spectacular archery event ever held in the United States. For the first time in over fifty years target archery will again be a gold medal event in the 1972 Olympics.

#### JOE AND HELEN THORNTON

Joe's start in archery goes way back to 1956. He started shooting bare bow as did most archers at that time. He shot in that division until 1960 when he turned free style. The next summer Joe won a place on the United States team and went on to win the World's Target Championship in Oslo, Norway.

Joe got Helen started in archery in 1962. After just one year's shooting she made the U.S. team along with Joe. That year Joe placed second and Helen placed eighth. In 1964 Helen won the National Target Archery Ass'n. Championship. They made the U.S. team again in 1965. Again Joe placed second and Helen moved up one place to seventh. From 1965 to 1969 the Thorntons placed in or near the top ten in every National they competed in.

Joe broke a ten year pattern in his shooting at the 1970 National Target Championships. He had always been a very consistent shooter. The other top competitors had come to know what scores it would take to beat Joe, and they knew if they didn't Joe would be number one. A few years ago Allen Muller said if you were going to beat him you had better shoot 1175 FITA or better otherwise he will beat you for sure. Joe's first FITA round at the 1970 National was true to form, a 1174. But when he came to the American round Joe shot a fantastic 796 to win the 1970 NAA Championship.

At the age of 54 Joe has the distinction of being one of the oldest men to win the NAA Championship. He is also the only American Indian (5/8 Cherokee) to win this tournament. The Thorntons were the only husband and wife to have both made the United States teams, as well as both winning NAA Championships. At the present time Joe is a member of the board of governors for the National Archery Ass'n.

#### VICTORIA COOK

Vicki is the "greatest amateur woman archer" in the United States today. Her desire and determination has no equal. Through many illnesses and surgery this burning desire to be the best woman archer in the world brought this lady many thrilling victories and many friendships. Her laughing and joking during the tournaments really show how much she enjoys competition.

Vicki started shooting in June of 1959 after a previous winter with surgery and the doctor's recommendation of fresh air and sunshine. She is very grateful for good coaching which she received first from Don Merrill who, she says, taught her to aim and then how to pull the bow. Only three months after starting, Vicki won her first Minnesota State Target Championship. It was also at this tournament she saw Bob Rhode and Bob Kadlec proudly wearing their blue blazers from the World Championship Team and she made up her mind she wanted to wear one too.

After finishing ninth in the 1960 National Archery Association Championship Allen Muller became Vicki's coach. From him she received the knowledge of archery and the inspiration for courage to shoot 1100 FITA rounds when she had been practicing only 950.

Two years after starting, Vicki qualified for the 1961 World Team. The team went to Oslo, Norway, and she came in seventh place. Vicki didn't do much shooting for a year and a half because of illness and surgery. Then 1963 rolled around and another year of world competition. There were many days of struggle to get back into condition. This time she didn't make the expense paid trip but paid her own way with help from those who had faith in her. Helsinki, Finland, was the site of Vicki's World Championship. Nancy Vonderheide battled back and forth until the last day when Vicki pulled out ahead at 50 meters by 38 points. The glorious victory was hers and a more deserving person it could not have been bestowed upon.

The 1964 National Archery Association Championship was the only national she won. All the other nationals she shot in she was the bridesmaid. Vicki brought home the Gold Dallin Medal for the 1961 N.A.A. Championship but, as Vicki says, Margaret Tillberry won the tournament. Nevertheless, Victoria Cook is truly one of the finest archers of our time.

### Marie Maczynska and Ray Rogers 1967 World Champions

#### RAY ROGERS

Ray started shooting tournaments in 1964 and by 1965 was shooting some very good scores. In 1966 he began a series of competitions with another outstanding archer, Hardy Ward. That year he won the amateur division of the Southwest Sectional Field Tournament and came in second behind Hardy in a Fita Star Tournament. Ray did not compete in the 1966 National, it was won by Hardy. 1967 will always be remembered in the NAA as Ray Rogers year. He started if off by winning the State Target Championship with a record 1203 FITA Round. He placed first in the FITA Tryouts with a record 1205-1190. He won the World Championship in Amersfoort, Holland and returned to the USA to win the National at Greene, N.Y. In winning the National he again set a new World Record in the FITA Round with a score of 1227. He still wasn't through for the year as he shot a 1230 FITA in the Ambassador Cup Matches. This tournament was called by one reporter, "another Ray Rogers Festival."

In 1968 Ray did not win the National, this was again taken by Hardy Ward. Ray came back in the Ambassador Cup Matches, winning the North American Championship for the second time with a record in one FITA Round of 1238.

In 1969 Ray placed second in the Tryouts and dropped to seventh in the World Championships at Valley Forge. He then came right back and again won the National Championship. In 1970, for reasons known only to him he did not compete. Ray Rogers will probably be best remembered by the world's archers as the first man to consistently shoot over 1200 in the FITA Round. His shooting style was his own, he copied no one. He made his own strings and arrows and was a perfectionist in setting up a bow.

The archery world is wondering if he will come back in 1971 and set some new world records.



#### HARDY WARD

Hardy's first major win was the 1963 National Junior Free Style Field Championship. The next year he won the National Junior Target Championship as well. In 1965 as the age of 15 Hardy shot the National Target in the men's division and placed 15th. At the 1968 National Target Hardy not only won the Men's Championship but in so doing broke a 33 year record. (In 1933 Ralph Miller had won this tournament at the age of 17.) Hardy at 16 had become the youngest champion in the history of the NAA. Hardy is also only the second man in the history of the NAA to have won both Junior and Senior Championships. (Bob Bitner was the first.)

In the spring of 1967 Hardy made the United States team that would go to the World's Target Championship in Amersfoort, Netherlands. He placed third behind Dixon of Great Britain and Rogers of the U.S. Even though Hardy shot 183 points higher at the 1967 National than he had in 1966 he still had to settle for second place to Ray Rogers. In 1968 it was the other way around; this time it was Hardy winning over Rogers by 10 points for his second National Target Championship.

With the 1969 World Target Championships being held in the United States, the competition for the U.S. team was the strongest it had ever been. Hardy made the number four spot on the team, which made him anything but the favorite to win the World Championship. Never in the preceding 24 World Championships had there been a contest like the one that took place between Hardy Ward and John Williams. After 288 arrows and four days of shooting only three points separated these two great archers. Hardy had won the 1969 World Target Championships.

Earl Hoyt has said of Hardy's shooting, "Hardy Ward is the greatest target shooter I have even seen." Strong words of praise from someone who has seen as many great champions as Earl has.



#### **EUNICE SCHEWE**

Eunice took up the sport of archery in 1955 and made the top class the first year. She shot her first national field cahmpionship in 1956 and placed eighteenth. Her first state bare bow field championship was won in 1958. Then in 1959 she won the state free style target championship as well.

Due to a number of operations Eunice didn't shoot much in the early 1960's. During her lay off a major change had taken place in archery which was amateur and open division compitition. Eunice stayed amateur and shot all the national field championships from 1966 through 1970. Not only did she win the amateur division in all five championships but her scores in four of them were higher than the open division champion. All these years she had been the best bare bow archer in the U.S. Her outstanding shooting went partially unnoticed because it was in the amateur division.

In addition to her N.F.A.A. titles she won the first National Archery Ass'n. Field Championship in 1968. 1970 was to be her big year at the National Field Archery Championships. She rewrote the record book by shooting 925 field and 936 hunters rounds and setting a new aggregate record of 2301. Her decision to stay amateur paid off when she qualified for the U.S. field team. For the World's Championship she had to change her whole style of shooting. She could not use a stabilizer or clicker and hardest of all learning to shoot on unmarked metric distances. Eunice came through like the great champion she is by winning the 1970 World Field Championship.

To this writing she has won six National and one World Bare Bow Field Championships. As one of her competitors said, Eunice is a good shot, a true champion and a very nice person. It's hard to beat that combination.





### **ED ROHDE**

Ed is highly respected by his fellow archers for both his shooting abilities and pleasing personality. Although he has won only one major tournament in the last six years, he has constantly placed in the top three or four in every major championship in which he has competed.

Ed's name first appears on the national level in the 1960 Ben Pearson Open where he came in ninth place. The next summer when I shot with him in Crystal Springs, Arkansas, he came in fourth in a field of top shooters. The first N.F.A.A. national indoor championship in 1962 found Ed coming away holding second place. The following summer he won his only major championship, the National Archery Association Championship which was held in Los Angeles, California. This showed him to be one of the top pros in the United States.

Proving himself to be one of the greatest all around competitors of our time, Ed placed in the top three in all of the national outdoor championships for 1965. An example of his tremendous indoor shooting was performed at the 1966 International Open when he fired a 299 out of 300 for his final round. He has placed in the money at the International Open four times in the past six years.

Ed is the proud holder of a perfect 560 Animal round record shot at the 1967 National Field Archery Association Championship. His grand total of 2714 for the tournament would have won any other championship held before but the fantastic shooting of Stan Warner put him in second again. When checking through the records it is interesting to note, except for the first N.F.A.A. Championship Ed shot in and he was sixteenth that year, he has never been lower than sixth.

A few weeks after the 1967 N.F.A.A. Championship Ed went to California for the Professional Archers Association Championship and battled for that coveted title. He tied for second with two other champions, Bednar and Gervais. At this writing Ed's shooting shows only signs of greater honors for an honorable man.

In private life Ed is a building contractor in Muscatine, Iowa. He is and has been a member of the Ben Pearson Advisory Staff for the last four years.

Evelyn and her husband, Bruce, started archery in 1958 but didn't start competition until 1960 when they also had a partnership in an indoor lanes and archery business. After four years of this it became too much for the family of four children so this was sold.

Evelyn and Bruce have been Professional Archer Association members since the beginning in 1962. She was seventh in the 1964 PAA Championship in Onsted, Michigan. In 1965 she climbed to second just behind Margaret Tillberry. Then in 1966 Evie dropped to fourth for this championship. All the glory and the light blue blazer were hers in 1967 in Pasadena, California. Despite the hot California sun and tight nerves Evelyn came through the championship with a one point lead over another great, Lou Shine.

The most difficult of all tournaments, the International Open, awarded Evelyn with two seconds for the years 1965 and 1967.

The year 1966 Evelyn had only one major win but a very nice one. She won her first National Field Archery Association Championship in Point Pleasant, West Virginia.

Five Michigan State Championships belong to Evie from a state of tough competition. In 1965 Les Brown became her coach. She recommends that anyone who wants to be a top contender should have a coach, because it was then that she became a champion.

#### DAVID HUGHES

David's win of the 1970 Field Archery Ass'n. Championship added his name to a very exclusive group of men who have won three or more National Field Championships. These men are Dr. Erwin Pletcher, three wins; Erwin Ketzler, five wins; Cliff Necessary, three wins; and now David Hughes with three wins.

David started shooting when he was just ten years old but did not come to national attention until 1967. Although he broke records at the 1967 National Field Championship he had to settle for second place as Frank Gandy broke the records by a little more. The experience David got paid off when he became the youngest man to win the Bare Bow Championship in 1968. This championship was no easy win for David as his friend Rick Gilley also from Texas who had placed third in 1967 pushed him all the way. This tournament really showed what great competitors these two young men were. David and Rick's margin over their nearest competitor was over two-hundred points. At the 1969 National Field Championships David was shooting stronger than ever. He set a new record in the field round of 1080 points and an aggregate of 2693 which was just 43 points under the free style champion and broke Frank Gandy's old record by two points. The 1970 National was a walk away for David as he won by 141 points over his nearest competitor.




David Hughes 1968-69-70 National Field Champion

Professional Championships

#### MARGARET TILLBERRY

The grand lady of archery would be no other than Margaret Tillberry. Her wins have been fantastic and her person not one forgotten. A quiet and reserved personality but a hidden desire to win make up Margaret. Even though she gives Dan, her husband and coach, much credit, one has to be outstanding in abilities to win as she has. She enjoys the friendships and competition that archery has brought her.

Margaret started her archery in 1956 but didn't enter the competitive field until the 1959 Ohio State Target Championship which she won.

Margaret has a fantastic record for the International Open. Starting her first year of 1959 she placed third. She was first in 1961, 1963, 1964, and 1967; second in 1962; seventh in 1965; and fourth in 1966. Her 1964 win was especially thrilling. On the second day of competition, about a third of the way through the tournament, Margaret was ahead of the men by four points. Her Chicago Rounds of 832 and 818 still stand as records. Margaret's high Professional Archers Association score of 294 was shot in the 1967 International Open Team event.

The first Professional Archers Association National was held in Daytona Beach, Florida in 1963. This is where Margaret won her light blue blazer and the championship. To follow this she was the champion in 1964 and 1965. In 1966 she placed second and in 1967 was seventh.

Margaret's first national was the National Archery Association Championship in 1960. She was 11 points out of first place and was pleased, as she should be. The years 1961 and 1962 she came through with the championship and top score.

Words have a hard time describing such a fantastic record. We only know that Margaret Tillberry is a legend of our time and a privilege to know.

#### LESTER GERVAIS

Cobo Hall in Detroit, Michigan, was the stage for the appearance of a new champion to archery. This was the 1966 International Open with 1102 competitors trying for the \$12,000 in prize money. To be the star for this day was a man named Lester Gervais known to many as "Jugger." He confidently fired a 297 and 295 on PAA rounds for top score and a \$1,000 prize. That day he also received \$650 extra for having shot perfects on the PAA round in previous competition. He also has the nickname "Mr. Perfect" and rightly so as he is the first to accomplish this feat in the PAA round and the Field round. He is the master of a clicker which only can be accomplished with much ambition and determination.

Les came to Point Pleasant, West Virginia, and claimed the 1966 National Field Archery Association Championship crown. During the first day of competition Les posted a new national record for the Field round with a fabulous 550 out of a possible 560. The double Field round and the double Hunter round plus total were also new records for this great archer. Over the five day event he defeated the defending champion, Dickie Roberts by fourteen points.

The 1967 United States Open Indoor Championship which was held in Las Vegas, Nevada, became Les' cherished win. He shot a 597 just three points off perfect of 600 for \$1,500, a nice return for his many hours of practice.

Les tied for fourth in the 1967 International Open. Third place was Les' in the 1967 N.F.A.A. Championship. To end up the year of 1967 Les traveled to Pasadena, California, for the Professional Archers Association Championship. He missed first place by three points but after the first round he was tied for tenth place and then climbed to second with a nice 297. Les hasn't been around as long as many of the other champions but he has made his presence felt in his pressure wins.



## ANN BUTZ

In our last book of Archery Champions Ann's picture appeared with one caption "1967" National Free Style Field Champion. Since then she has dominated the women's free style in every event she has entered. Field, Indoors, Outdoor PAA rounds have not shown any barrier. Superb concentration, confidence and co-ordination mixed with unending practice, have made Ann number one in the pro ratings.

When I first heard of Ann she placed sixth at the 1967 International Indoor Open in Detroit, Michigan. She had been shooting around New York State in the bare bow class, setting one record after another before that. Jackson, Mississippi was the sight of her first National title. She shot 965 Field Round, 1048 Hunter Round, and 548 Animal Round which still stands today. To add to her first NFAA Championship she won the 1968-69-70 titles to make it four in a row. Her most cherished win was the 1969 National Professional Archers Ass'n. Championship. Ann won the 1970 N.S. Indoor Championship in Las Vegas. To complete a fabulous record Ann added the 1968-69 International Open Indoor Championships to her bank account.

The fact that Ann has won eight National Championships in the last five years is a tremendous feat by its self, but what is even more astounding is the margin by which she has won most of these championships. In only two of these wins had there been any doubt of the outcome. At this writing Ann's shooting shows only the promise of many more wins to come.








## **BILL BEDNAR**

Bill is and has been one of the top competitors in the United States for the last six years. His nerves of steel and superb concentration have brought him to the honored place of top money winner in the United States. No one in archery competition has the ability of shutting out everything as Bill does.

Target archery was where Bill started in the mid 1950's. His name first appears on the national level in the 1961 Ben Pearson Open where he was second in the amateur division. He competed in the 1961 National Archery Association Championship and placed seventeenth. That year he also tried out for the World Championship team and qualified. He traveled with the team to Oslo, Norway, and placed tenth in this thrilling championship. The only other N.A.A. Championship Bill appeared in was in 1962 when he was sixth.

Bill turned pro in 1962 and really showed the world what a great competitor he was. The 1963 Professional Archers Association Championship was held for a first time and was in Daytona Beach, Florida. Here Bill won the coveted title, light blue blazer, and \$1,000. He placed third in 1964. Then he came to Detroit, Michigan, in 1965 and captured his second P.A.A. Championship title. Only four points separated him and Ed Rohde who claimed second. Point Pleasant, West Virginia, was the site of the 1966 P.A.A. Championship. During the last day of competition in a trial with the rain and jovial George Clauss, Bill came through with his third championship title by only four points. A three way tie for second was Bill's position in the 1967 P.A.A. Championship which was held in Pasadena, California. This tremendous record can't be praised enough for the quality of competition.

The 1964 and 1965 National Field Archery Association Championships were second places for Bill.

The most difficult of all tournaments, the International Indoor Open, was won by Bill in 1964. He shot a pair of 840 Chicago rounds to outclass his competitors. Detroit, Michigan, was again the location of the International Indoor Open in 1965. Bill tied with another great indoor competitor, Jim Ploen, for first place. Ties were broken that year by high game so Bill had to settle for second. Bill was fourth in 1966. The 1967 tournament found second place Bill's again. Bednar is truly a master of concentration and a champion competitor.



## JIM PICKERING

A recent Bear Archery Company advertisement featured Jim with the caption "Gentleman Jim." A truer statement could not be made for there is no one on the shooting line who is more of a gentleman than Jim. Jim is a very fine all around archer, but really displays perfection indoors. His style of shooting makes every shot look so easy that you would think he was never under any pressure. Unlike most top archers, Jim has a very soft release and holds considerably longer. Although he shoots with a high anchor, he has classic target form.

A third place, in the 1962 U.S. Open in Las Vegas, really started Jim's place among the greats in indoor archery. The glorious win of the 1963 Ben Pearson Open made him and his wife, Donna, \$1,000 richer. He defeated the top professionals of the day such as: Caspers, Partin, Pender, and many others to surprise many in the archery world. Jim participated in the 1963 National Field Archery Association Championship which was held in Enchanted Forest, California, and came in third, but only twenty-four points under champion, Don Cavallero. That year he also won the Covina-Downing Open and the ill-fated Enchanted Forest Open with some brilliant shooting. The fantastic groups Jim shot at thirty yards in the Covina-Downing Open were unbelievable. Since then he has been one of the leading competitors in major tournaments. Jim placed ninth in the 1964 Ben Pearson Open. Then he came up to fourth the next year and dropped to seventh in 1966.

Early in 1967 the U.S. Open was held in Las Vegas with Jim capturing second place. Only six weeks later he traveled to Detroit, Michigan, for the International Open and he came away victorious in a field of the finest archers of our time. "Gentleman Jim" must be called "the finest indoor archer in the world."

## MARIE STOTTS

"Indeed life does begin at forty, that's when I discovered archery," is a quote from Marie. She only regrets all the wasted time she could have been shooting archery. The deep love for archery was immediate once her son and husband convinced her she should try it.

Marie shot barebow for the first three years starting in the fall of 1961. The wish to be the best resulted in Marie declaring herself in the top class after only six months of shooting. Four months later she found herself winning the 1962 National Field Archery Association Championship in Arkansas. This she highlighted by setting a Hunter's record that stood for three years and a new aggregate record. She also won the California State Target Championship in the professional division at Long Beach this year. Six records still stand to this day so she was really a great barebow archer in target as well as field. To make 1962 a true milestone in Marie's life she also captured the Southwest Sectional Championship. At the 1956 N.F.A.A. Les Speaks was her coach and he still is today.

Marie placed second in the 1964 N.F.A.A. held in New York to end her winnings in the barebow division.

Having shot freestyle less than a year she went to New York for the 1965 N.F.A.A. Championship honoring herself with a second to Lou Shine. She broke the aggregate record but it wasn't enough.

Marie had a wonderful year in 1966. The California State Field Championship and the California State Target Championships were hers. In the target championship she set 13 out of the 14 records and tied the fourteenth which all still stand. To make it a perfect year she won that wonderful light blue blazer and all the prestige that goes with it. This of course was the Professional Archers Association Championship which was held in Point Pleasant, West Virginia. This prize of \$1,000 went home with Marie to California. The single round of 292 and aggregate of 1135 still stands.

Many seconds and thirds have filled Marie's memory book and I'm sure many more firsts will be to her credit in the years to come.



#### VICTOR BERGER

Victor Berger one of our greatest archers came to this country in 1956. He was born in what is now called East Germany. He made his first bow at the age of 12 while the war was going on around him.

When he was nine years old, he began a ten year period of being moved from one displaced persons camp to another. Finally winding up at a displaced persons camp at Salzberg, Austria. From there to the United States, sponsored by the Rev. Kay M. Glasener. Here he found happiness, he adds nothing can beat this country.

Vic started to shoot competitive archery in 1962. His first American round was shot in a wheat field at Urbana, Ohio. At this time he was having a hard time keeping his arrows in the field, let alone hitting the target. But with a little advice on how to set up his bow and some well meant words on form he was off to a career in archery.

Vic won the PAA National at Pasadena, Calif. in 1967. He shot 297 the first day and a fellow archer wanted to bet \$50 he would not win the tournament, but like the champion he is went on to win it. He again won the PAA National in 1969.

Las Vegas 1970 National Indoor Open and what a year, 899 out of a possible 900. How do you describe that kind of shooting? Stupendous, fanstastic, there are no words that give the kind of praise he deserved. After the 299 the first day he was walking back to the hotel and said to his wife Betty, I wish I had not dropped that point. She replied do it tomorrow and that is what he did the next day as well.

Vic has won several State Championships and scored well on the PAA sanctioned tours. He has shot several 300 rounds in the AIAA league shooting. Vic was voted the PAA personality of 1970. He is a humble and gracious champion, always willing to help a lesser archer. Add all this together and you come up with a great champion.



Victor Berger 1967-69 National P.A.A. Champion 1970 U.S. Indoor Champion





## LUCILLE SHINE

"Lou" Shine does just what her name says, "shines among the best," when it comes to lady archers. She started the sport in 1954 when her son, Eddie, wanted Mom and Dad to take up archery. Her first state tournament in 1956 found her in second place behind Jo McCubbins. Then she traveled to the National Field Archery Association Championship in Colorado Springs, Colorado and found she was good enough to make the top ten. Up till 1957 she shot barebow and at that time turned freestyle. Seconds and thirds plagued her until she won her first California State Championship in 1958. To date she has won five state crowns.

The dream of every archer is to shoot on the United States International Team. Lou had that dream too. She tried out for the 1959 team only to come in fourth. Under private sponsorship she made the trip to Sweden and to prove her capabilities she not only placed third but out-performed two of her teammates to accomplish this. She still wears her blue blazer as a memento of this honor. Desire to be the best has grown over the years to make a marvelous competitor.

The year 1962 was glorious for Lou. She was both the N.F.A.A. Champion and the National Indoor Champion. Smashing all the records in 1965 bestowed another N.F.A.A. championship on Lou after she traveled across the entire United States. She has attended twelve straight N.F.A.A. Championship, 1956 through 1967, and never placed less than sixth which was only twice and the other years she was in the top three. One of her biggest thrills was being the first woman to break the 1000 mark with a 1005 record in national competition.

Immediately after the 1958 N.F.A.A. Championship the first Bear Money Shoot was held with Lou placing fourth and becoming \$100 richer. In the 1960 N.F.A.A. Championship she placed third to qualify her for a bigger Bear-Easton Money Shoot. Lou came out shining \$1,000 richer and honored with another title.

The 1966 United States Open or Sahara-Colt found Lou in twelfth place the first day. Not to be the kind to give up, she ended up fourth. In 1967 she returned to cop the crown and \$700.

During the 1967 Professional Archers Association Championship in Pasadena, California Lou had an arrow for arrow battle with a friend, Evie Goodrich, only to lose by one point. Hers have been the many thrills of winning and the friendships that make one's life shine.

Each of these points was worth \$100 as that was the margin over second place. If you think this was exciting you should have been there the next year. After the first day of shooting Gwen was five points behind Sue Rusch. She came back the next day and captured the title by a single point. Now that is something to make your knees weak and I know many were. The 1964 and 1965 Mid-Atlantic Indoor Championship are also her achievements.

The light blue blazer and the Professional Archers Championship were hers in 1968. That year the P.A.A. started putting out a P.A.A. shooters standings and Gwen was ranked number one.

Gwen became a certified P.A.A. instructor in 1969 and worked as a lanes manager. She enjoys teaching young people and I know young and old people enjoy her.





