

In 1961 The National Archery Association had to make one of the hardest decisions in its 80 year history. The Amateur-Professional controversy had been coming up every few years since the mid 1920's. The strongest arguments for a division were brought forth by Russ Hoogerhyde and Mrs. Olive Bessco in the mid 1930's and again by Larry Hughes and the Wilson Brothers in the late 1940's. But each time it was decided by the Board of Governors that it would not benefit the Association to have two divisions. By 1959 there were a number of money tournaments throughout the United States. The U.S. team that swept the 1959 World Championships in Stockholm, Sweden had all shot for or won money. Needless to say this did not set particularly well with F.I.T.A. and the National Archery Association was told that archers that had competed for or won money would not be eligible to shoot in future F.I.T.A. Championships. Late in 1960 the Board of Governors voted to make provisions for 2 divisions in all future National Archery Association Championships. But the highest scoring Amateurs in both the Mens and Womens Division would still be the official champions and would receive the Dallin Championships Medals. When the ruling came down it wiped out 80% of all the top U.S. Competitors. However, most of the shooters that had been declared professionals (or non-amateurs as they called it then,) still continued to compete in the National Tournaments. In fact in 1961 and 1962 the high score in the Womens Division was shot by a Pro, (Margaret Tillsbery.) In 1962-63 and '65 the high score on the mens line was shot by Pros (Bob Pender, Ed Rhode and George Clauss respectively). By the late 1960's the number of professionals competing in the National fell off to only a few archers. Some archers still to this day hold hard feelings toward the National Archery Association for making the decision. But it was something that had to be done.

The years from 1962 through 1978 have been very productive for The National Archery Association. Under the leaderships of Clayton Shenk and George Helwig the Association launched many new programs. In 1967 Margaret Klann put on the first National Intercollegiate Championships which was a great success. This tournament has grown tremendously the last years and rivals the National Championship Tournament in attendance. In the mid 1960's George Helwig started the Junior Olympic Archery Development Program (or J.O.A.D. as it is now called.) This was also a tremendous success. There can be no question that these two new programs along with the before mentioned International Program have been the salvation of the National Archery Association. Today 75% of all the competitors at a National Tournament have either come up through the Intercollegiate or J.O.A.D. Programs.

In 1968 the Association decided to try Field Archery again. This program has not been very successful. But it was an area that the Association had to get into because F.I.T.A. launched its own Field Archery Program in the mid 1960's. Through the efforts of Clayton Shenk the First National Archery Association Indoor Championship was held at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in the Spring of 1969. The indoor championships have steadily grown in size over the past 10 years. The 1979 Tournament is expected to draw nearly 1000 shooters.

As in the previous Volume I will do very little writing myself. As the minutes and write ups on the National Tournaments are quite complete. It is, however, very disappointing that at this writing I have not been able to locate copies of the Minutes for the years 1949 and 1954-55. Should they surface in the next year I will include them in Volume IV as I have done with a few photos that should have appeared in Volume I, but can be found in the first pages of this Volume.




