All indoor rounds are to be shot with 60 total arrows consisting of 20 ends of 3 arrows each. The outdoor rounds consist of 36 arrows at each of four distances for a total of 144 arrows. The first two outdoor distances (*the long distances*) consist of 6 ends of 6 arrows each and the second two distances (*the short distances*) consist of 12 ends of 3 arrows each.

Jr. World Indoor Team Selection

The 2003 Team will be made up of the top 3 male and top 3 female Junior (only) archers from both the compound and recurve divisions as ranked at the 2003 World Indoor Archery Team Trials. The 4th ranked archer in each category will be the alternate. Selections will be made from the Round Robin total scoring following the 18m Qualifying 600 Round. The team will represent the USA at the 7th World Indoor Target Championships in Nimes, France March 4-9, 2003. A minimum of 2 qualifying 18m FITA scores is a prerequisite to achieving final selection, and these scores can be shot anytime between 1/8/2001 and 1/5/2003. They are for recurve: 575 (men) & 555 (women) and for compound: 580 (men) & 560 (women).

JOAD Olympic Round Competition

Up to the quarterfinals match, archers shoot 3 ends of 6 arrows each or 18 arrows total per match. From the quarterfinals through the gold medal match, archers shoot 4 ends of 3 arrows each or 12 arrows total, at the following distances:

JOAD Olympian Teams (aka JOAD Award Camp)

Four archers from each region are selected each year. Each region is to be represented by 2 compound and 2 recurve archers. Each archer must have already achieved the Olympian award status by April 1st of the qualifying year. Selection is based upon qualifying points attained from any four tournaments (*minimum of 3*) shot in the previous year of which, two must be outdoor tournaments, which shall be from the following:

Jr. USAT Team Selection

The 2004 Team is to be made up of the top 5 Junior male and the top 5 Junior female archers as well as the #1 Cadet male and the #1 Cadet female archers from both the Recurve and Compound divisions.

Selection will be based upon the FITA Round of the **2003 JOAD National Championship** in Denver, CO, (also final tiebreaker) which is a mandatory tournament, as well as final placements from two of the following 2003 qualifying tournaments:

Archers desiring to make the team are also required to shoot in the Jr. US Open (elimination round) following the 2003 JOAD National Championship. Individual Gold Medalists from the 2003 Jr. World Indoor Championships and/or the 2003 JOAD

National Championships (Juniors & Cadets) will be added to the 2004 team if they were not already selected as a result of the above described process.

Each archer must also shoot at least one outdoor qualifying FITA round at a NAA sanctioned Star FITA event or a NAA sanctioned Qualifier between 7/27/2002 and 8/1/2003 with a minimum score of:

All archers will also need to successfully complete the 12-minute Cardiovascular Fitness Test with a rating of at least "Fair" or better.

In addition to the above requirements, it should be noted that in order for any tournament scores or club scoring (qualification) rounds to be utilized in documenting the various eligibilities, rankings, awards, team qualifications or trips earned, the archer must first be a member in good standing with the National Archery Association (NAA) as well as a member of a NAA sanctioned JOAD club and the scorecards must be signed by the archer documenting his/her name, complete address, date of birth, the division involved (recurve or compound), the distance shot, the size target face used, the award level achieved (if appropriate), the appropriate JOAD club name, and it must be witnessed by a NAA recognized JOAD club leader. The scores must be shot in a club qualification round of no less than three archers shooting together under the direction of an adult club leader or at a NAA sanctioned tournament.
